In Barrington alone, the high school has
three full-time music teachers compared
to East Greenwich's one. Barrington also
has three more performing ensemble
classes and five more music education
courses, such as music history or audio
production.

Notably among Barrington's
performing ensembles were chorus,
concert choir and choral ensemble.
Although East Greenwich has an award
winning chorus program at the middle
school, the high school only offers a
before school club.

"There were still students who wanted
to continue in their music education, but
we didn't have anything to offer them,"
Lee said.
Although the club offers students an
opportunity to keep singing, Lee said
it is just that. There is no assessment
or credit award, and participation can
become an issue of equity and access
for those who may not be able to arrive
early before school. In addition to having
540 instructional minutes per academic
