SUMMARY

In recent years a number of new trends have become evident. The most salient being; mental health concerns, opioid misuse and vaping. In addition, substances like Lean (cough syrup mixed with candy and soft drinks) have entered the scene. These new challenges have been addressed in classroom presentations and will continue to be explored.

Finally, cultural norms and attitudes towards drug use continue to receive attention. Substance abuse does not evolve from a vacuum. The program's end of year report will offer statistics pertaining to these trends and dynamics.
