She explained that developers are receptive to the new provision and she is working with current plans being considered now to meet affordable housing requirements.

Following some opening remarks from President Cienki and VP Todd, Councilor Granatiero provided a summary of an analysis he compiled related to financial issues that may be of concern to residents. Comments followed on how to measure effectiveness and delivery. It was noted that the funds for the Financial Town Meeting have been allocated to fund this project and the Town's website is being revamped. The existing resources available on the Town's website would be used to disseminate information to the Town residents, as well as possibly using a mailer to inform residents about the Town budget. An overall communication strategy was discussed and how to communicate with the residents about upcoming project needs in the Town. Revenues such as State Aid and NEIT were addressed. Ms. Bourbonnais spoke about her success using email to disseminate Planning news and the past practice of a Community Survey done via telephone. 

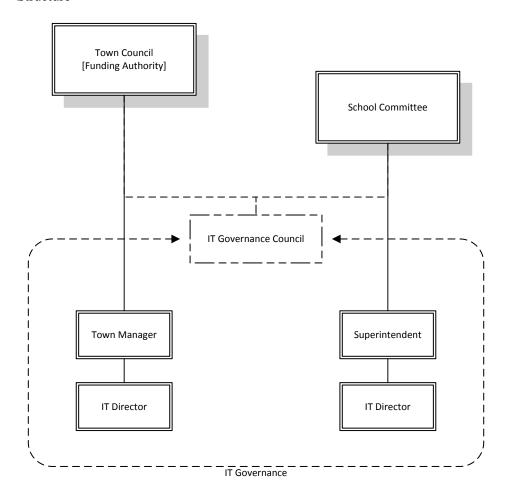

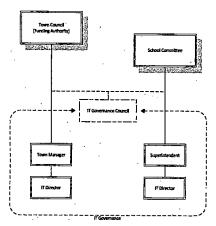

On Tuesday, February 21, 2017, bids were opened in the Town Council Chambers for fertilization, over-seeding, aeration, and other applications for the Town and School fields and grounds. Bids were sent to seventeen (17) vendors who provide this type of service and it was advertised in the East Greenwich Pendulum's February 9, 2017edition, on the Town of East Greenwich's web site, and posted at the Town Hall's and East Greenwich Free Library's bulletin boards. Three (3) bids were received.

This is a bulk bid, where various items are bid so that the Department can have a menu of items to choose from in order to make applications as conditions of the fields dictate. The ability to choose applications is inline with an Integrated Pest Management Program (IPM); products are not applied unless needed. The bid is written so that the Town has the option to pick and choose items and is not locked into every item.

The bidders were very close in pricing. The determining factor that separated the group was the cost of seeding. The more seeding that is performed the further apart the bidder's pricing became. The cost was calculated on the anticipated over-seeding for 2017.

Due to our past experiences, type of service received and improved field conditions from prior work performed by **Seascape Lawn Care**, they are the best qualified bid, conforming to specifications, for items 1-4 (fertilization applications), 5 (aeration), 6-7 (anticipated overseeding), and 13-14 (Duration applications).

Therefore, I recommend award of the best qualified vendor, to **Seascape Lawn Care** 1610 Flat River Road, Coventry, RI 02816.
